Within the state of Massachusetts, there are several food security assistance programs dedicated to providing healthy and nutritious food to lower income households who cannot otherwise benefit from such resources.

Types of Assistance

- Food Banks
- Food delivery programs
- SNAP (Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program), a state-funded food security program sponsored by the USDA
- CNOP, a state-sponsored and funded program dedicated to ensuring school and summer meals to children in need
- Massachusetts HIP (Healthy Incentives Program), an add-on to SNAP that refunds part of the money spent when used at certain vendors.

What is SNAP?

- The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, previously known as food stamps, is an initiative funded by the state that gives lower-income households and individuals additional income for foodrelated purchases.
- This is done via a specialized debit card known as the EBT card, which the DTA uses to deliver most of its financial aide.

What is HIP?

- HIP, the Healthy Incentives Program, is an accompanying feature to SNAP that reimburses a portion of SNAP money that is used to buy healthy, local produce from vendors participating in the HIP program.
- HIP is also included with SNAP alongside the EBT card, so no additional applications necessary!

What is unemployment aid?

Unemployment assistance can include anything from assistance in collecting unemployment benefits to guidance in seeking legal ramification to unjust or unlawful unemployment.

What is Pandemic Unemployment Aid (PUA)?

PUA provided up to 79 weeks of benefits to individuals who were unable to work because of a COVID-19 related reason but were not eligible for regular unemployment or extended benefits. PUA ended the week of **September 4, 2021.**
